

MMG ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLING PROGRAM PRESENTATION TO LOCAL COMMUNITY, FRIDAY 19 FEBRUARY 2010

- > MMG wrote to Rosebery residents on 21 December 2009 informing them of our plans to conduct an independent environmental sampling program.
- > MMG consulted with relevant Government regulators in the formation of the testing program.
- > MMG invited residents to participate in the program.
- > Today is part of the commitment to feedback on the results of the program openly with Rosebery residents.
- > MMG will:
 - o Provide an outline of the program and how it is being conducted
 - o Answer any questions you may have about the process
- > The program is not completed so it is too early to discuss actual results, but we will tell you what else MMG is doing around this issue.

Why is MMG doing the testing?

- > MMG shares the community's concerns at recent talk of heavy metal contamination in the township.
- > MMG wants to take appropriate steps to ensure we are fully informed of the facts.

Who is doing the testing?

- > GHD has been engaged to undertake the sampling program.
- > GHD is one of the world's leading engineering and environmental consulting firms.
- > GHD employs more than 6000 professional and technical consultants across its global network with operations in 16 different countries.
- > GHD is a leader in the assessment, rehabilitation and management of contaminated land and has extensive experience within the mining sector.

What has GHD been asked to do?

- > GHD has been asked to obtain preliminary analysis and assessment of the contamination status of key locations and residences around Rosebery.
- > If elevated levels are observed, GHD will consider possible sources/explanations for these levels and develop an appropriate action plan to address any associated risk.

What is GHD testing and where?

- > GHD will analyse all samples for ten parameters:
 - o Arsenic
 - o Cadmium
 - o Copper
 - o Chromium
 - o Thallium
 - o Lead
 - o Manganese
 - Mercury
 - Nickel
 - o Zinc
- > GHD has been asked to focus on three key geographical areas:
 - Public areas within the township ie schools, playgrounds and places of congregation 17 locations
 - o Residents who nominate to have their property included in the program 42 locations
 - MMG Rosebery Mine owned or occupied residences in the Rosebery township 66 locations

> The total number of samples collected will be 780.

How is it being done?

- > Collection of samples at each of the locations:
 - Between one and seven soil samples, retrieved from a location most likely to be accessible to community members with preference to sampling ground with no or minimal vegetative cover.
 - One surface water, water tank, storm water and/or ornamental pond sample (where possible).
- > MMG properties and private residences:
 - Collection of samples at each MMG residence and any private residence volunteered for the sampling program:
 - Between one and seven soil samples, retrieved from a location most likely to be accessible to household members with preference to sampling ground with no or minimal vegetative cover.
 - One surface water, water tank, storm water and/or ornamental pond sample (where possible).
 - One dust sample in the ceiling cavity
 - One dust sample within the residence, aiming for the most utilized area: ie living room.
- > Additional requirements:
 - o Soil samples will be collected from the surface (0-100mm Below Ground Surface).
 - Surface water, tank, storm water and/or tank samples will be collected where possible, and dust samples will be collected using swabs.
 - o All collection methods and sample preservation in accordance with relevant scientific guidelines and Australian Standards.
 - o GHD will analyse results against appropriate guideline limits and health investigation levels
 - o GHD will assess each location and provide advice on the number of samples for that location.
 - o Samples will be subject to IPC mass spectrometry.

What else is happening?

- > MMG is conducting a bio-monitoring program of its workforce starting 23 February.
- > The program is in addition to routine testing done by MMG on employees/contractors.
- > It was also agreed to offer the same service to families of employees or contractors who reside in Rosebery.
- > The purpose of this program is to screen for occupational exposure and to see whether there are any potential pathways for "take home" contamination.
